



Child Safeguarding Statement

Dressage Ireland is the Governing Body for Dressage in Ireland.

Dressage Ireland, (*in conjunction with Horsesport Ireland- National Governing Body for Equestrian Sports*) through its Branches/Regions provides various sporting activities, training and opportunities for young people through participation in regional/provincial events at national & local level.

Dressage Ireland is committed to safeguarding children.

Working under the guidance of **Children First Act 2015**, and our Safeguarding Policies, **Dressage Ireland**, (Organisation, staff, Officials, volunteers and employed) seeks to create a safe environment for young people to grow and develop within sport and throughout the organisation,

Principles to safeguarding children from harm:

The set of principles as outlined below should be strictly adhered to:

General Principles–

Dressage Ireland recognises that in accordance with legislation and our Codes & Rules, that the welfare and interests of children are paramount in all circumstances. This statement aims to ensure that all children have a positive, developmental and enjoyable experience, as far as is practicable, in a safe and enjoyable environment.

Integrity in relationships –

Adults interacting with children in sport are in a position of trust and influence. They should always ensure that children are treated with integrity and respect, and the self-esteem of young people is enhanced. Children/Young Persons are entitled to be listened to by Adults interacting with them and to feel safe.

Importance of childhood –

The importance of childhood should be understood and valued by everyone involved in sport.

Quality atmosphere & ethos –

Children's sport should be conducted in a safe, positive and encouraging atmosphere.

Needs of the child –

All children's sport experiences should be guided by what is best for children. This means that adults should have a basic understanding of the emotional, physical and personal needs of young people

Equality –

All children should be valued and treated in an equitable & fair manner regardless of ability, age, gender, religion, social and ethnic background or political persuasion.

Fair Play –

All children's sport should be conducted in an atmosphere of fair play. The principles of fair play should always be emphasised, and organisers should give clear guidelines regarding acceptable standards of behaviour.

Competition –

Competition is an essential element of sport and should be encouraged in an age appropriate manner. A child centred ethos will help to ensure that competition and specialisation are kept in their appropriate place
